This training will introduce participants to the history of labour law in Canada and show how this history shapes labour law in Saskatchewan today. Special attention will be placed on the ideology of labour law and its limits, especially in an era of austerity. The training will also touch on key cases for grievance arbitrations, recent decisions of the Saskatchewan Labour Relations Board, as well take a look at *Charter* litigation including *Saskatchewan Federation of Labour v. Saskatchewan*, which created a constitutional right to strike.

- ◆ **Applicants must submit a written letter outlining why they believe their participation in the course would benefit their local union and their development as an activist.**
